I hope that you will send this on to our members:

We have been contacted by a past 'client' (adult who structured a portion of their settlement) who has recently been inundated with numerous calls to her unlisted phone number and mailings from factoring companies. In addition, she has received numerous credit card calls and mailings. She feels her privacy is being invaded and cannot understand how anyone would know about the structured settlement annuity transaction, particularly when she was required to sign a confidentiality agreement for the settlement. She has insinuated we may have provided that information, which bothers us greatly.

One of the factoring companies that contacted her [REDACTED] claims this is public information, but there was no court order on record and a confidentiality agreement was required. The defense broker is with [REDACTED]. If this information is being sold by structure brokers, there should be some liability for breaking confidentiality in the role we play.

We are also concerned that her attorney may not call us in the future. Many of the attorneys we work with believe that structures are a good choice for their clients, but not when these type of problems are surfacing.
